Another very busy week across the BAWB Federation. We would like to start by thanking the year 6 children for their wonderful attitude towards their SATs.

Grace, Ellie, Ruby, Ben, Jack Dalton, Phoebe, Jack Dinsdale, Fred, Peter, Gracie and Aylish have been superstars and we are so incredibly proud their positive attitude and the mature way that they approached the tests. Thank you again to Mrs Robinson and Miss Collins for preparing and helping them to remain calm and positive. We would also like to thank teachers for releasing their support staff to invigilate, Mr Billingham for teaching the year 5 children at Askrigg and Mrs Donno-Fuller for teaching the year 3/4/5 children at West Burton. A great team effort!

Option 3A

You will be aware of the high profile reports about our federation in the local press.

Please be assured that the Governing Board (GB) of the federation are working extremely hard to drive the best possible future scenario for our schools.

The decision to implement Option 3A from September 2018 was taken after much deliberation and was agreed in order to support our pupils and their educational well-being within a sustainable structure.

Alongside this decision there was acknowledgement of the support from some to defederate one of our schools. So the GB are carrying out a due diligence study in 3 parts.

This will include;

1. A consideration of the best possible educational scenario for the pupils of our federation including the educational implications of defederation.
2. An in depth financial study of forecasted budgets of the 3 schools as a federation of 3 schools and a federation of 2 with 1 standing alone.
3. A Human resources study which would ensure that correct decisions are being made on the staffing of the schools.

The outcome of this due diligence work will considered at an Extra ordinary GB meeting on 19th June. A decision will be made on 11th July regarding the future of the federation. As you will probably realise this is very late in the academic year to implement any changes for September 2018 so consideration needs to made for this and its impact on staff and pupils.

Please be assured that the GB will be striving to establish the best possible option for the future education of your children should this mean a federation of 2 schools with one stand alone or continue with the model of a federation of 3.

We are all very conscious of the impact of this uncertain period on yourselves and also your/our children and we are

doing our best to eliminate any stress and/or upheaval for them during this process.

29th May 1899: *'Reopened school this morning with 72 present. The coughs which have been so prevalent amongst the children for some weeks, seem now to have developed into "whooping cough"; the absence of upwards of 30 is caused by this complaint. 73 present this afternoon.'*

6th May 1901: *'Outdoor botany lesson this afternoon at Mill Gill with the First Class. We collected and named 29 different flowers.'*
