Dear parents, friends and members of the community,

As promised, we are writing to share details about the rescheduled shared community engagement project for this term alongside colleagues at the Local Authority and the Diocese. The purpose of this is to set out the current financial and educational issues facing our federation at this time, to present some of the possible ways in which to address these, and to listen to the views and suggestions of all stakeholders during this process.

What, where and when?

We would like to invite you to one of our open drop-in sessions which will be held on **Monday 26th February** at the following times and locations:

1:30pm – 3:30pm	Askrigg Primary School
5:00pm – 7:30pm	West Burton Primary School

Please note that, though we have organised separate sessions in all three villages, community members and parents of children at any of our schools are very welcome to attend **any** of the sessions. We hope that holding three sessions will enable people to choose the one that is most convenient. We also anticipate that the evening session may be a little busier, hence it being the longer of the three sessions, though each drop-in will follow exactly the same format:

Format of the drop-in sessions

It is our intention that drop-in sessions will enable all stakeholders to have the opportunity to ask questions and/or voice their views with the appropriate people in a more relaxed environment. There will not be a formal presentation but the sessions will be attended by a range of people (see below) who will be available to answer specific questions or provide specialist information. Any questions which we are unable to answer on the day will be recorded and answered at a later date.

Information prior to the drop-in sessions

In order to provide you with as much information as possible before these sessions, we are working on a detailed document which provides background and history, lays out details of our current position, and explores some possible future options. This will be with you no later than a week prior to the drop-in sessions, and hopefully before half-term. Supplementary detailed information will also be available on our websites on this date (much of which has been previously circulated).

Who can come to the drop-ins?

These sessions are public, and anyone with an interest in our schools, or with questions / views to share is warmly welcome to come along. Please note that if you are unable to attend, there will be an opportunity for your written contribution to this process after the drop-in sessions and that all contributions, either in person or in writing, will be considered in the same way.
