June 11th 1907: *'Mr Hugill complains of rough treatment of Mildred Hugill by Miss Carling. I saw no evidence of such, but spoke to the child myself this morning for defying her teacher. Miss Carling denies the charge. Mrs Terry writes asking that more severe treatment may be meted out to her grandchild Annie – who also is in Miss carling's class.'*

June 27th 1944: *'Received notice that Kenneth Allinson, a private evacuee who has attended this school for the past three years, has been awarded a Special Place in the Tynemouth Municipal High School.'*
