From the Log Books

School log books are held in our schools and they are a marvellous record of social, and educational, history. We will reproduce extracts in this section. This week's is from West Burton's log books.

June 14-18, 1875: Thomas Horner, while cleaning the school, broke a pane of glass, which he is willing to pay for. The total amount for school purse for quarter ending March 31st is £9, 13 shillings and 6d and the expenses for that quarter beyond salaries is £2, 15 shillings and 4d .

June 22, 1921: There are three children absent this afternoon, two of whom are working in the hay field and the remaining child is sick.
