- sensory development as we explore the texture and add different scents added from our herb garden

Many of our outdoor activities are now undercover. It cannot be stressed how much we love our new shelter. It has just made our outdoor area a much more fluid and inviting part of our Early Years setting. We have been spending a great deal of time outside including joining the Y1s and Y2s for communal playtimes which are such fun. We are so lucky to have such a super outdoor area and so many delightful, happy, kind, eager, creative children to enjoy its potential.

Inside we have been focussing on mark making at all different levels from large to small motor skills with different resources. Nursery children have been doing Dough Disco using 'Shotgun' as a backing track. All children in the school instantly abandoned any pretence of listening to their phonics input and just started singing when the song filtered through. Mrs. Johnston put in an official complaint questioning whether the children really should be having that much fun? Turns out that yes they should be having that much fun and Mrs. Johnston's attitude has been put down to age and a compromise reached of turning the volume down.

Don't think the Reception children haven't been doing fun handwriting exercises. They have. In the summer Mrs. Loughlin spent days hand stitching squares of fabric so the children could develop their letter formation in the style of Morris dancers. That may be an exaggeration; Mrs Loughlin used a sewing machine but it still shows dedication.

Well that is only a fraction of what we have been doing this week. We are very excited about next week as it is Harvest and Forest Schools so that means bread and hedgehogs. An interesting combination
