




Dear parents and friends,

School Trends




Water Bottles

A reminder that water bottles are available to purchase from any of our schools. The cost is £1.50.



1903 - 8th June Re-opened School this morning with 83 present – Ringworm victims have returned.

Since the 3rd April the following have been absent because of Ringworm.

Ernest Kirkbride age 7 Ringworm began 15th April has not healed as yet and has had 110 days off this year.

James Kirkbride age 8 Ringworm began 23rd April and has healed 20th May and has had 35 days off this year.

Thos. Kirkbride age 13 Ringworm began 23rd April and has healed 20th May and has had 35 days off this year.

Clem Foster age 7 Ringworm began 21st May and has not healed as yet and has had 57 days off this year.

Annie Kirkbride age 11 Ringworm not healed as yet – 33 days off this year.

Elizabeth Kirkbride age 10 Ringworm healed 15th June – 30 day so ff this year.

Mary Allison age 8 Ringworm not healed as yet 18 days off this year.

Mabel Foster age 4 Ringworm not healed as yet 122 days off this year.

We still have 5 children kept from school because they have Ringworm. Up to "Breaking up day" the possible attendances lost to the school from this cause alone since 26th March - 765
